Reading

Please send home reading bags to school every day so children can use them to take home letters, spellings etc as well as their books. Please continue reading as much as possible at home as reading progresses faster when parents listen to their child read daily. Please complete the record book as a log of books read. If you choose to read other books as well as the ones sent from school feel free to record those in the home reading record too. We regularly assess every child's reading and provide them with books within a "band" according to their ability to read but also to understand and talk about what they have read. There are a range of texts at each level, some books have few words. Ask your child to tell you about the story or information from

Literacy

In Literacy this half term we will be focusing on the following:

- Predicting what will happen in a story before we read it.
 - Writing clear sentences with capital letters, descriptive adjectives and the correct punctuation.
 - Using conjunctions to extend sentences.
 - Learning story maps to help us re-tell stories.
- Writing character descriptions.
- Writing non-fiction reports about dinosaurs.
- Forming our letters correctly

Numeracy -

Year 1

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- Count from 0 10.
- Read and write numbers and number words 0-10.
- Use terms more than/fewer when comparing sets of objects.
- Use cubes to show number bonds to 10.
- Adding and subtracting within10.

<u>Year 2.</u>

- Recognise, read and write numbers to 40 in digits and words and make concrete representations.
- Represent numbers as some tens and some ones on a place value chart.
- Compare numbers using the terms more than, less than, greatest, smallest.
 - Adding two 2 digit numbers using the counting on method.
 - .Subtracting 1 and 2 digit numbers from 2 digit numbers.
 - Solving 1 step addition and subtraction
