Outcomes for 2017/18

1. School data indicates that at the end of KS2 Pupil Premium children perform as well as non Pupil Premium for RWM Combined. This is above the 2017 National Average of 48%.
2. At the end of KS1 there is a considerable gap between the performance of Pupil Premium (33%) and non Pupil Premium (62%). Addressing this will form next steps for these pupils(tracking)
3. Look for barriers in KS1 EG Persistent absenteeism, mobility.
