#### **Home Reading**

Children continue to bring home reading books every Monday, please read these with your child during the week and they will be swapped the following Monday. Could you also please write down these (and any other books they may read at home) into their reading record. Reading records will be collected on a Friday to be signed. We really appreciate all the helpful comments people have been writing in these books.

Phonics books will now be sent home on a Thursday instead of a Tuesday. Your child will have been practising reading this book in school prior to bringing it home so this is a chance for them to show off and demonstrate to you how well they can read the text

Please make sure your child's book bag is in school every day and is small enough to fit in their tray. We are finding that many children do not have their home reading books or reading records when we want to read with them in class and have nowhere to keep their letters etc so this would really help us out.

#### Maths
