

I particularly enjoyed seeing The Coronation Chair including the Stone of Scone – or The Stone of Destiny – which we had talked about in assembly.

The Year 6 children have had their SATs assessments this week. Whilst we do everything we can to prepare them academically and emotionally, the week always brings nerves and trepidation. There have been some challenging papers — as to be expected — but the children have handled themselves perfectly. a great school trip: they went to a plant workshop, acted out how seeds grow into plants and planted their own seeds which they got to take home. They explored the gardens and played in the beautiful play areas.
