

Self-awareness

Welcome back to the summer term. Let's hope that the temperatures catch up with the change in season soon. It has been a short, 4-day week this week that has gone by very quickly.

On Monday, Miss Akram told the story of Passover in assembly, which is a Jewish celebration. She brought matzah — unleavened bread included on the Jewish Seder plate during Passover — for all children to try. Miss Akram's assemblies are always interesting and teach us all something new about world celebrations.

Before the holidays, we held a charity football match against Sandy Lane and the updated total is just over £700 that has been raised to support Turkey and Syria following their devastating earthquakes. A huge thank you to all parents and carers who have contributed.

Next week, staff are visiting local bookshops to select and purchase new reading books for class libraries. You will recall I told you about a visit we had from Bradford school advisors in the last week of last term. We received the report this week and are thrilled with what they concluded about school:

'School leaders have responded thoughtfully and highly effectively to the recommendations made by Ofsted inspectors in June 2018. As a result, they are making good progress in making the further improvements to this good school.'

'School staff are highly ambitious for the children, as their strong, developing curriculum continues to evolve and improve. The school has invested a great deal of time and effort into designing an appropriate curriculum for the children of Steeton. It links to the school's vison of being an 'inspirational community' drawing in the children and their wider network of significant contacts. Over time, the curriculum builds upon the children's experiences and finally their place in the world, moving outwards from home to classroom, local stimuli, as well as national and global.'

'Magic Monday promotes the wider curriculum and the skills and attitudes related to this, particularly resilience and problem solving.'

'The EA met with two members of the Steeton Governing Board. They have a clear understanding of the work of the school and spoke of ways that they both support and challenge the leaders.'

'Teachers are determined to ensure a consistent and effective approach to teaching and learning in maths which supports good progress for all pupils.'

'The school is dedicated to enabling every child to read and has centred its curriculum around reading. There is a real love of reading that oozes through the school and is clear throughout the learning environments and corridor spaces. '

'Relationships between staff and pupils and each other are very positive. In lessons pupils are engaged and interested.'

'The Executive Headteacher and Head of School lead the work of the school with a high degree of moral purpose, ensuring that the children are at the centre of all that is undertaken. The Head of School is well supported by the Deputy Headteacher. Together they have a clear vision and are leading a strong staff team. Across the school, there are really committed and knowledgeable middle leaders.'

The children were exemplary throughout the day and spoke highly of their teachers and other adults at school. I am very proud of each and every member of our school.

Finally, our cross-country runners travelled to Temple Newsam in Leeds for the rescheduled West Yorkshire final today: Anna, Annabel, Florence, Hollie, Kara, Albie, Logan, Arthur and Joseph. It is a fantastic achievement to reach this stage of the competition and they have all done so well.

From all the staff at school, we would like to wish everyone celebrating a very happy Eid and we look forward to enjoying our parties on Monday when fasting is over.


