

Our forest principle this half term:

Self-awareness

In assembly on Monday, I outlined our forest principle for this half term: self-awareness. This can be defined as: having a sense of one's own personality and character; and understanding one's emotions, strengths and weaknesses. We looked at how many of us were good at different things, such as sport, drawing, reading etc. And, unsurprisingly, we were all good at different things.

We also looked at how we can recognise our emotions. For example, when we feel cross or angry, children said we may feel warm or like there is a rock in our tummies. If we are happy, we may smile or feel light inside. Lots of children in all years had really insightful things to say about their feelings and how they made their bodies feel. Then we thought about how we can recognise the triggers for those emotions. If we feel upset and frustrated when friends play a particular game, then we can try to find another game to play with others to avoid that feeling. If we feel tired, we need to listen to our bodies and rest. A useful, simple website to look at as a family is <u>Self-Awareness - BBC Bitesize</u>.

Eid parties were great fun on Monday. Miss Akram brought in a selection of party clothes for staff and we all felt very special. 


