


12th April 2024 Summer Term Week 24

We love to play using our imagination and so we don't need things like balls or beanbags - these get easily lost or thrown onto the road.


We are trying to raise enough money to make the surfaces of our playground - the walls and floors stimulating and more exciting, and maybe add more features like the pirate ship which everyone can play
