


Our adventures at Steeton Primary School this week ...

 and that they know how to regulate themselves or who to speak to if they need to.

 that you have booked your session on Ping. With only 12 weeks of school remaining this year, it
 is important that you know how to support your child to maximise progress.
- Thank you to everyone who has completed the surveys via Ping this week. We are working with Bradford Council to establish demand for wraparound childcare and your views will help to give a clear picture. With regard to 32.5 hours of school a week and adding 15 minutes to each school day, we appreciate that everyone's view will differ around where to place the extra time. Once we have completed the consultation, we will inform you as soon as possible about the changes from September.
