




There have been an increase in the number of children leaving before the end of the school day.

We are trying to raise enough money to make the surfaces of our playground - the walls and floors stimulating and more exciting, and maybe add more features like the pirate ship which everyone can play


Unfortunately, these are really expensive and even though our aim of £5,000 seems like a lot of money, it actually won't go that far towards what we want.
