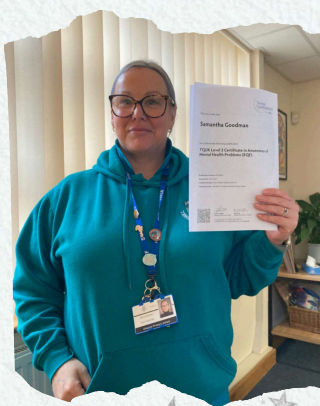
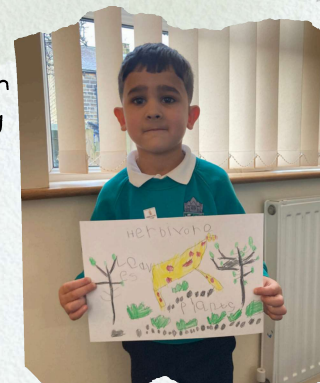


Forest Principle: Resilience

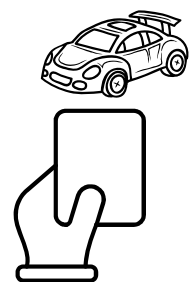
