Literacy / Early Reading

Phonics-Read Write Inc

We will be learning Set 2 and consolidating Set I sounds. We will continue to learn how to blend words orally and blend sounds to read simple words, captions and sentences.

We will continue with Drawing Club!
Texts as a stimulus for Drawing Club will be

The Enormous Turnip by Greg Bottrill
Jack and the Beanstalk by Greg Bottrill
The Little Red Hen by Greg Bottrill
We're Going on an Egg by Martha Mumford
We will retell parts of the stories.
We will draw and begin to write simple sentences.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

As Scientists' we will have the opportunity to plant seeds and begin to learn about the parts of a plant or flower.

On our trip to Harlow Carr Gardens we will explore the gardens and look at the many plants. We will find out what a seed needs to grow and take part in a planting workshop.

As Historians we will find out about the life and works of Vincent Van Gogh. We will think about when he lived and what he did in his lifetime. We will look at a range of his paintings, in particular his Sunflowers. We will compare his life with that of the artist Georgia O'Keefe.
